

Cyber Safety Awareness Workshops - Empowering Students, Parents and Staff

Our school recently hosted a series of **Cyber Safety Awareness Workshops**, conducted by **Ms. Shilpa Chandolikar**, a renowned advocate for cyber safety and child online protection. Through the Ahaan Foundation's flagship initiative, **Responsible Netism**, Ms. Chandolikar and her team have successfully educated over 1 million children and adults about responsible online behaviour.

The workshops were designed to educate students, parents, and staff about the importance of responsible online behaviour and cyber wellness.

Students' Workshop:

On August 21, 2025, students from Classes 8, 9, and 10 participated in a 1 hour 30 minute workshop that covered essential topics such as:

- Types of cybercrimes against children
- Psychological impact of irresponsible online behaviour
- Technical tips to secure accounts and devices
- Legal implications and reporting mechanisms for cyber incidents

The session aimed to equip students with the knowledge and skills to become resilient, handle online distress effectively, and become responsible internet users.

Parents' and Staff's Workshop: 'Building Digital Guardians'

On August 23, 2025, parents and staff attended a 1 hour 45 minute workshop titled **'Building Digital Guardians'**. The session focused on:

- Managing screen time effectively
- Constructive use of social media
- Safe online gaming practices
- Security tools and measures to protect accounts and devices
- Reporting mechanisms for cybercrimes

Both the workshops emphasized the significance of cyber wellness and its impact on children and youth. By working together, we can empower our children to stay safe online and become positive influencers of change.

Let us join hands to equip our children with the knowledge and skills to navigate the online world safely. Together, we can build a safer and more responsible digital community.
